Uncle sentenced to 20 years in prison for sexually assaulting niece

PASIGHAT, July 21: The Special Judge POCSO Act, East Siang District, Tageng Padoh sentenced a man to 20 years of imprisonment with a fine of Rs 10,000/- (Ten Thousand) under section 6 of the Protection of Children against Sexual Offences Act.

The accused was found guilty of committing aggravated penetrative sexual assault against the 10 year old daughter of his step-brother. The FIR was lodged on 27th July 2021 at Mariyang Police station by the father of the victim stating that the accused had sexually assaulted his 10 year old daughter on 22nd July 2021 while the victim was staying at her grandparents' house in Damro village during her school vacation and a case under section 376 IPC R/W section 6 of the POCSO Act was registered against the accused. On the day of the incident the accused came to the house of the grandparents during daytime where the victim was alone as the grandfather had gone to work and the grandmother had gone to the field and sexually assaulted her. The incident came to light when the victim disclosed and narrated the whole story to her grandmother.

An amount of Rs 7.5 lakhs was given to the victim as compensation under the Arunachal Pradesh Victim Compensation Scheme 2011.

Moreover, numerous kutcha houses were swept away, and several other houses in Ra-

japa Colony, near Yeshe Garage in Dirang, suffered partial damage.

In response to the situation, the DDMA and Dirang Administration have issued an advisory, urging people to stay away from the riverside and remain vigilant during the night. To address the emergency, the 12th Battalion of the National Disaster Response Force (NDRF) has been deployed.

Is Arunachal ready for Emerging Technologies?

(Nyatum Doke)

The juggernaut of Digitization is pervading every inch of our life. Off late, everyone has realized the importance of running in tandem with the ever-evolving technological development and the GoAP is not an exception. The first of its kind capacity building workshop on 'emerging technologies' was conducted for the officials recently by ATI under the aegis of GoAP recently. The rate at which technological growth is happening, is unanticipated and unprecedented. Every second, the world around us is changing, pushing our existing set of skills and knowledge towards redundancy. In this parlance where do we stand- are we running fast enough?

Charting the Path,: the efforts taken-

As per PIB report "Over 1,310 Gram Panchayats have been connected with optical fibre under Bharat Net scheme and over 1,156 more towers have been planned to bring digital inclusion". To add, recently, dedicated 254 4G mobile towers to the state the towers will cover 336 villages. Also 1,156 4G towers planned under USOF, locations have already been identified.

As part of another scheme, i.e. 4G saturation scheme, 2,424 4G site sites are to be installed ,which includes 270 sites through OFC, 1,237 sites through microwave and 917 through VSAT to bring more connectivity. Also, under the Vibrant Village Programs and other schemes the government is looking forward to bridge the physical as well as digital gap, thereby ensuring inclusive growth and Inclusive development: reaching the last mile.

An Introspection: Is all well?

The efforts of the govt are commendable, however the installation of towers as we have seen on many instances does not ensure necessary service. The tower needs constant power supply and most of the time owing to erratic power supply the efforts get defeated. Then, the maintenance of the entire set up, be it a mobile tower station or a VSAT needs skills, even for minor maintenance work or defects the services get affected for months- same is the case with optical fibers- which is more delicate. Therefore, along with the quantity, ensuring consistency of the service and quality human resource is crucial.

Training the officers and the officials is a good step, but we also need to take up a bottom-up approach. Reaping the benefits of Digitization or Emerging technology would require an overhaul of our educational system. We need to revamp and take forward with vigor the programs like 'Adhunik Shiksha Yojana (Smart Classroom)' that was launched by CM some years back. The Smart Classroom if pursued in the true sense has the potential to bring great change- however we seldom find smart classrooms in schools.

Also, apart from just making the classroom smart we may also take up efforts to make the students smarter. We may encourage the students to look beyond the traditional subjects and learn basic computer Programming, Computer Language, emerging technologies etc by introducing it into the syllabus of the schools. I understand it sounds difficult- but the future will be a lot more difficult if the early initiation is not made. We

may try to do it on a Pilot basis in a few selected schools. Then, the skill training being sponsored by Govt under various schemes should include training related to repairing and maintenance of V-SAT, Telecom towers, Computer Hardware and other related future proof skills apart from focusing on mundane skills. It will help in preparing a pool of future ready youths.

When will Arunachal be ready?

Though. Arunachal is in a nascent stage of digital revolution, and a discussion on emerging technology may look like a farsighted dream. The questions like " is Arunachal Ready for emerging technologies" or "when will Arunachal be ready" then, is a misnomer, as the digital revolution is already becoming a reality, it's everywhere; as the saying goes "we are forced to love something that we would otherwise prefer to love to hate".

With emergence of sophisticated and pervasive technologies- new cultural and social dynamics will evolve. We need to prepare and make ourselves ready for all the challenges that the emerging technologies may bring. Revolutionary beginnings have already been initiated by the GoAP. Surely, in days to come we will be able to embrace the forces of digital revolution along with the emerging technologies with fewer hiccups and less hesitations.

RGUPET-RGUCET 2023 Phase-I draws close: Entrance conducted in 6 exam centers with USTM as one of the centres RGUCET-2023 Phase-II scheduled for 30th July, 2023

RONO HILLS, July 20:

With precisely 3439 number of combined seats in 91 programmes including PhD, Post Graduate courses, Undergraduate courses, PG Diploma and Certificate programmes ranging from conventional to technical and professional ones, of which 1390 seats are spread in RGU's affiliated colleges against 9 selected programmes, the Rajiv Gandhi University conducted the first phase of the two entrance examinations namely; RGUPET-2023 and RGUCET-2023 at six designated centres smoothly. The centres notified for RGUCET-2023 were at RGU's Rono Hills campus besides at University of Science & Technology Meghalaya near Guwahati, Jawaharlal Nehru College at Pasighat, DeraNatung Govt. College at Itanagar, Indira Gandhi Govt. College at Tezu and at Govt. College Bomdila campus and was conducted from 11th July to 20th July, 2023. Candidates have selected their Examination Centers as per their own preferences and conveniences. Meanwhile, the RGUPET-2023 for admissions to a total of 141 PhD vacant seats in 28 departments was conducted in RGU campus only which was scheduled from 17th to 20th July, 2023.

The Vice-Chancellor of the University Prof. SaketKushwaha, while expressing his satisfaction on the successful conduct of the RGUPET & RGUCET-2023 phase-I said that RGU is striving to be amongst the top performing universities of the nation. He further disclosed that this year it may be the last year when RGU as a central university will be conducting the common entrance test for the last time as the university is committed to join the CUET conducted by National Testing Agency in line with the undergraduate courses. Since last year RGU had joined the CUET for its five undergraduate courses, namely; BCA, BSc. (Agriculture), BSc. (Geology), BFA and BMus to which the students shall be admitted through NTA conducted CUET. He further disclosed that, RGU's Dept. of Education has been identified to run BA-BEd. 4 year Integrated Teacher Education Programme from this year with 50 seats and for the same the NTA is conduct-

ing NCET, and for it the portal of RGU is live and receiving candidatures already. Interested candidates can apply for this course till 25th July, 2023 in <https://rgucuet.samarth.edu.in/> and <https://ncet.samarth.ac.in/>.

Dr. NT Rikam, the Registrar while informing that RGU being ranked under top 150 universities amongst a thousand plus universities in India by National Institutional Ranking Framework of MoE has all the potentialities despite its locational remoteness and bottlenecks. He further informed that the results would soon be declared and the candidates could get updates on the website of RGU www.rgu.ac.in. The Finance Officer of RGU Prof. OtemPadung, while paying a visit to the entrance halls informed that, RGU conducts the entrances with piouness and is able to attract students from across the nation giving it a true pan India character. University also distinctively takes part in all the flagship programmes of the Govt. of India and implementation of NEP-2020 is one of those.

RGU's Joint Registrar Dr. David Pertin while briefing the data of the two entrances informed that 15849 candidates have applied to vie for a seat in different courses and programmes on offer, which is a very encouraging sign for the University and speaks volume of RGU's popularity in the state and in the region. He further informed that candidates who were appearing in final semester/year examinations of any qualifying degrees were eligible to apply and sit for the ensuing RGUPET & RGUCET-2023. However, their admissions on selection through entrance shall be confirmed only after scrutiny of the original documents and the result of their respective qualifying examinations. On type of question, he further informed that, generally, there were 100 multiple choice questions except for B.PEd. programme where total questions were restricted to 50 nos. only. University has introduced PhD programmes in the newly opened Department of Food Technology, this year besides in 27 other departments. In PhD., the University has earmarked a supernumerary seat for eligible army personnel and officers since

the last academic session. Dr. David Pertin further informed that, for the successful conduct of the entrances, a 12 member Central Co-ordination Committee for Common Entrance Tests, A 24x7 helpline is also in place to attend to the queries of applicants led by RGU's team of technical experts and all day Help Desk was also operational manned by the NSS volunteers of RGU in the campus. Selection through entrance in all departments including physical tests, skill tests, personal interviews and Group Discussions in departments like Physical Education, Mass Communication, Law and Management and their final admissions shall be completed latest by August 11th, 2023 and the classes will commence for all the programmes from August 14th, 2023. The RGUCET-2023 Phase-II also had been announced and for eight Undergraduate programmes namely; Four Year BSc. (Major) in Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics & Statistics and Four Year BA (Major) in Anthropology, Sociology, Psychology & Bachelor in Social Work (BSW) the entrance date is already scheduled to be held on 30th July, 2023 at RGU centre only. A total of 80 seats are kept in these newly launched programmes in the campus' Institute of Undergraduate Studies. The programme modules will be totally based on National Education Policy-2020 guidelines and parameters. For this all the syllabi and Course Structures have been already framed and implemented by the university including its affiliated colleges which run conventional degree courses such as BA, BSc.,BCom. and BSW.

Prof. SK Patnaik, the Chairman of the RGUPET & RGUCET Central Coordination Committee informed that, the two entrances fared well with 83.21% attendance despite inclement weather conditions prevailing in the region. Time slots were maintained as per prescribed schedule in all the centres and discipline ascertained through the observers from RGU. He further disclosed that 5389 candidates competed for admission to 1090 BEd. seats spread in RGU's dept of Education and 10 affiliated teacher education colleges in the state.

District Administration seizes tobacco and tobacco products

AALO, July 20:

Tobacco product worthRs 2.50 Lakh (Rupees two Lakhs fifty thousand) was seized from various shops by the flying squad and was later on burnt down before the Magistrate in Aalo Women Police Station.

The flying squad team led by Smt; MabiTaipodia, ADC West Siang Aalo for effective implementation of COTPA 2003 raided the various shops nearby school premises and other places.

During the surprise checking some grocery shops were found sell-

ing tobacco products in contravention to provision of section 6 (b), (Prohibition on sale of cigarettes and other tobacco products within 100 yards of Educational Institutions) and Section-4 (Prohibition of smoking in Publics Places).

It was also found that some shops were selling tobacco products without the valid license. ADC directed them to update their license and also warned the shopkeepers not to sell tobacco and its products, if any shopkeepers were to be found selling of all

these tobacco products their license would be canceled and she also inform all the shop owners not sell tobacco products in school premises as youths are prone to tobacco products. She further said that such more inspection will be carried out in the days to come.

The flying squad as its members hadSri MaryomKarlo EAC Town Magistrate, Dr. DubomBagra DMO cum DNO (NTCP), Dr. TseringWangmukato (DSO), Officers of Trade & Commerce department, Tax & Excise and Police Forces.

She further requested the Panchayati Raj members to work in convergence with the line departments for planning and execution of

all developmental works.

AE, B. Khamyang urged the members of the committee to effectively carry out the role of VWSC and collect maintenance charge from every household and also to ensure its proper utilization towards operation & maintenance expenditure of water supply facilities. Explaining about JJM and it's objectives he said that JJM is a community managed program facilitating rural communities to lead the planning, management, operation and maintenance of village water supply systems.

A brief deliberation on Swach Bharat Mission was held after the inauguration program.

The team inspected the work being done under SBM. 6 numbers of solid waste pits have been construct-

ed in the village.

A complaint register and water tariff register was also handed over to the Chairman of VWSC in the event.

Located in Kosambi (Kasik-II) village Namsai, the Lift water supply plant was built under Jal Jeevan Mission sanctioned in the year 2022 and executed by Public Health Engineering Department (PHED) Namsai with a Functional household Tap connection (FHTC) coverage capacity of 57 households. The unit was officially handed over to Village Water & Sanitation committee (VWSC), Kasik-II for its operation and maintenance work.

AE, PHED Namsai Bhupen Khamyang, J.E M. Mongmao, GPC, other PR members and the general public were also present.

Health awareness at schools carried out

KHONSA, July 25:

Keeping in view the acute conjunctivitis outbreak and its prevention in Tirap District – Deputy Commissioner Tirap Hento Karga accompanied by District Medical Office Dr. N. Lowang and medical team from District Health Society, Khonsa carried out awareness program at Govt. Town Secondary School, Khonsa on 24th July, 2023, at Govt. Higher Secondary School, Khonsa - JNV Kheti, Don Bosco School, Kheti on 25th July, 2023. Similar health awareness program in different schools including RK Sarada Mission Girls' School and KV Khonsa will be conducted on 26th July, 2023.

While interacting with the Principals/Headmasters and the students - DC Tirap advised all students & staff to maintain hygiene to mitigate the spread of infection, he said that closing down of schools will not be a solution because it will affect

academics rather each and every one should try individually to break the chain of infection by maintaining social distance and hygiene.

DMO Dr. N. Lowang -made an awareness on how the Conjunctivitis spread and how to prevent it. She added that the steps to prevent spread of Virus are- avoid touching of eyes or face, frequent hand wash after every 1 hour, avoid sharing of handkerchief & towels, avoid sharing of cosmetic.

District Surveillance Officer (Dr.P.Rakshit) informed that this viral infection typically resolves on its own within a week or two and he also highlighted about the symptomatic treatment as there is no particular medicine for viruses because Conjunctivitis is a viral infection but symptomatic treatments can be done in case of fever, pain in eyes & tear eye drops can be given.

All the Health centres (CHC,

PHCs & HWCs) in Tirap District also conducted similar awareness program on Acute Conjunctivitis at different schools under their jurisdiction to mitigate the spread of infection.

Meanwhile, keeping in view of reports of wide spread conjunctivitis among general public, especially among the school going children of Deomali Township Area since last few days. ADC Deomali Vishakha Yadav, IAS issued an executive order directed and to directed to all educational institute of Deomali Sub-Division viz __ Govt. Schools, Private schools, Anganwadi centers and Balwadi etc to remain closed for 4 days w.e.f. 26th July to 29th July, 2023. Further, all the denizens of Deomali are requested to follow preventive and precautionary measures at all times. And MO I/c. of CHC, Deomali and BEO Deomali were directed to report conjunctivitis cases to the office of the ADC, Deomali.
